Presentations about Human Rights/ Bullying, unlearning bad habits, confronting discriminatory language, knowing rights, protecting self and others, online/chatroom considerations - starting in Elementary schools, partnered with local actor Sam Darkoh

SD41 School Board has shifted how to deal with bullying to focus on Human Rights and are seeing positive results.

Question - How is success measured?

Answer: Children complete "do you feel safe at school" surveys…this data is related to tracking outcomes and success of programs like this

Question - Are there resources for teachers?

Answer: Yes, there are ProD sessions available that have been delivered at schools for Pro-D days.

Question - Is anti-racism the overarching theme, or are other types of marginalization/forms of bullying covered separately or within this heading?

Answer: Yes - all forms of bullying are covered as per ministry program <u>ERASE</u> (click here for the ERASE reporting tool)

Question - What is process for proposing new courses, and is there a potential for racism to be covered within curriculum - for example in the proposed <u>Holocaust course for grade 12</u>?

Answer: requires approval from the Board - needs to uphold core competencies. There is oversight to ensure issues aren't presented one-sided or in binary manner.

Question - do you see a role for PAC / DPACs to support these Anti-Racism initiatives? Are there presentations that you can share with parents/ guardians so that we can have shared language/ similar launching points for these important topics.

Answer - Yes, parents and guardians can help by raising awareness about Human Rights. Having knowledge about these programs and talking about Human Rights with our children helps. Beth will share presentations that she offers at schools.

Question - Due to the political climate in the USA, the idea of <u>sanctuary schools</u> in BC is coming up. How has the SD prepared for American children moving into our schools to seek safety from persecution in the USA? <u>New</u> <u>Westminster SD40 Sanctuary School policy</u>.

Answer: Policy review is being undertaken, and sanctuary schools are being discussed in this process. The SD may adopt new policies here.

Question - Parkhurst elementary has gender neutral washrooms - will this happen at more schools in the future?

Answer - all schools have gender neutral washrooms (other spaces have been repurposed), and new builds have this as a more deliberate part of the design. Single stall washrooms are difficult to renovate
